

The Orlando Kart Center Super League: Powered By Skip Barber: Round 1 Format

Qualifying Session

Qualifying format 5-minute timed session

Heat 1

Grid decided by qualifying results, fastest laps at the front. Heat 1 duration, 15 minutes:

Heat 2

Grid decided by top 15 drivers reversed. (Driver who finished 15 starts pole, driver who on heat 1 starts 15th, driver who finished 16th in heat 1 starts 16th)

Heat 2 duration, 15 minutes

C Final

C Final for the lower heat scorers, Grid decided by points and then fastest laps.

Top 2 drivers from the C final are promoted to the B Final.

C Final duration, 10 minutes.

B Final

B Final for the lower heat scorers, Grid decided by points and then fastest laps.

Top 2 drivers from the B final are promoted to the A Final. B Final duration, 10 minutes.

A Final:

A Final for the top heat scorers and the top 2 from the B result.

A Final drivers will all race in ProKarts

A Final duration, 15 minutes.

Minimum Driving Time (45mins)

Maximum Driving Time (1 Hour 5 minutes)

Grid decided by points from previous 2 heats.

Best heat score, final score and any extra points go towards the championship table. A driver's worse heat will be deleted.

The weekly score will only be best scoring heat and points scored in the final PLUS any minus points will affect weekly score

Success "Ballast":

Round Winner: Round Winner will receive a **EIGHT**-place grid penalty for the following round Round 2nd Place: Round Runner Up will receive a **SIX**-place grid penalty for the following round Round 3rd Place: Round Third Place will receive a **FOUR**-place grid penalty for the following round

Driver Weight:

All drivers must meet the minimum driver weight to take part in the Super League Championship.

The minimum weight is 84KG. (185LB)

Drivers who carry maximum weight and still don't reach the 185LB will receive a 5-place grid penalty for whichever final they qualify for.

Heavyweight drivers: Drivers over 95KG / 210LB will race in the Heavyweight class

Additional Rules & Regulations

Driver Age Limits:

There is no age limit, drivers must be tall enough to fit comfortably in the karts.

ABC Boards:

What is an ABC: An ABC means Advantage By Contact: A driver has gained a position by making contact with another driver (gained an advantage by making contact) If this happens and ABC board will be shown to the offending driver OR a penalty will be applied after the race. This rule will be active during the A Final

Contact Warnings:

Driver making contact will receive a three-strike rule, this will be carried throughout a full racing round: The three-strike warning is as follows:

- . Contact Warning
- . Final Contact Warning
- . Minus Points
- If a driver makes totally unnecessary contact or deliberate contact they will move instantly to their third-strike, or be black flagged from the race
- *What is excessive contact: Excessive contact is contact the Race Director believes is avoidable, for example a driver decided not to slow and to use the driver ahead as a brake in order to gain an advantage / loading a driver into a corner

Weaving / Blocking:

Drivers can defend their position; however **excessive** blocking will result in minus points or an ABC penalty for the defending driver.

Race Destroying / Win preventing / Promotion Ending ABC: If a driver ABC's another driver which the race Director believe is a "Race Destroying" ABC IE: Knocking a driver from 1st to last or an ABC where a driver looking to win promotion from the B or C Final or win a weekly round penalty points will also be applied along with the ABC, it's the Race Director discretion as to how many penalty points are applied.

Championship:

At the end of The Super League Championship, if a driver is joint on points the positions will be decided by number of round wins, if the result is still level it will be decided by the number of second place finishes, then third place finishes. If the drivers are still level the final result will be decided by the drivers fastest lap.
